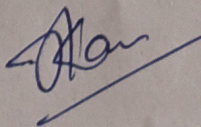
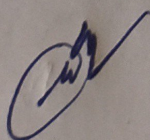

Course Outcome (CO)-5

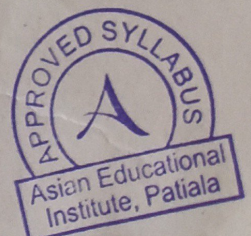
